### **Databases:**

### **ABC-Clio**

Using the American Government database is a great place to get started. The database offers OVERVIEW information and COURT CASES related to your topic. Use the TOPICS navigation panel on the top left side of database near the Quick Search field. Scroll down to RIGHTS and LIBERTIES to find the different units you may be researching. (Reference source)

### **Gale Virtual Reference Library**

Offers the reference book: Supreme Court Drama Cases electronically. You will also find court cases related to your unit of study. (e-book)

### **Opposing Viewpoints**

Search by subject and then click on the News or Magazine

### **SIRS**

Search by subject. Once you find your results, you can sort by type (newspaper, magazine, etc.) and date.

Click on "view subject index" on the top left. Under "history" click on "The Supreme Court".

### **Links to National News**

The best way to search for articles related to your unit of study is to wrap your keywords in quotation marks (i.e. "freedom of speech," "freedom of religion," etc.).
